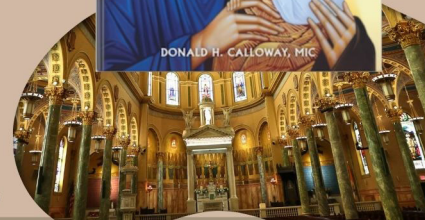
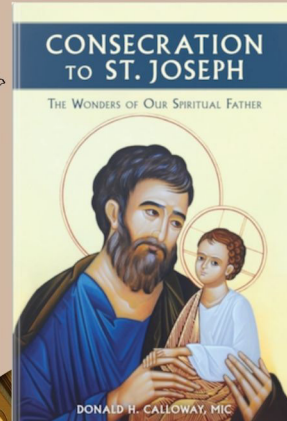

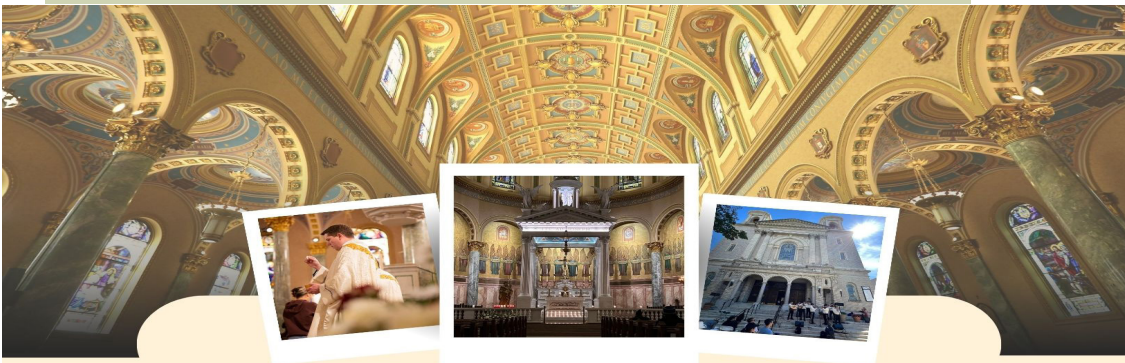

The Benefits of Marriage:

- ▶ Married adults live longer lives, have better health, and greater personal happiness.
- ▶ Children raised by both parents at home perform better in school, have less addiction, less teen pregnancy and less trouble with the law.
- ▶ Marriage is the unsung anti-poverty program.
- ▶ Single motherhood is greatest cause for poverty among women and children.
- ▶ Married adults have more wealth and financial stability.
- ▶ Healthy marriage saves U.S. taxpayers—costs \$112 billion per year for divorce and unwed childbearing.

We Can Do Better

Huge decline in married adults: from 79% in 1970 to 57% in 2013

US births to unwed mothers grew from 5% in 1960 to an alarming 41% in 2008

White, working-class, U.S. children living with both parents declined from 96% in 1962 to only 37% in 2004

Never-married Americans soared nearly 4-fold from 21 million in 1970 to 77 million in 2012

Teen birth rate for girls when their father leaves before they are 6-yrs-old is 35%. 7 times the rate from when fathers stay married.

Boys without fathers at home are twice as likely to end up in prison

Marriage Reduces Poverty

We'd have 25% less poverty today if we had the marriage rates we had in 1970

Only 2% chance of poverty if you finish high school, work fulltime, & postpone marriage/child bearing until age 21. 77% chance of poverty if you don't do these 3 things.

In U.S., marriage drops probability of child poverty by 82%

REGIS HIGH SCHOOL: REACH

Taking place on Saturdays and summers, REACH is a free educational and enrichment program exclusively for middle-school Catholic boys run by Regis High School in Manhattan. Since 2002, REACH has placed over 530 young men at partner Catholic high schools, and our Class of 2023 just earned over \$3.5 million in scholarships and financial aid commitments at outstanding schools like Regis, Fordham Prep, and Xavier.

HOW THE PROGRAM WORKS

REACH students attend summer and Saturday Sessions in their 6th, 7th, and 8th grade years. The summers and Saturday sessions are designed to help each young man compete for a Catholic high school scholarship and develop as leaders committed to our **Five Principles**: Openness to growth, intellectual skill, becoming more loving, becoming more faithful, and service to the community.

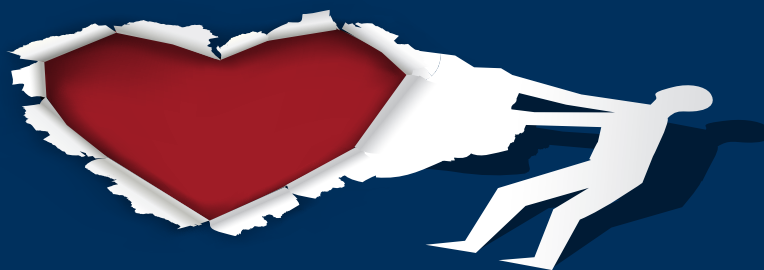

What is happening to our humanity?

There is no shortage of reasons to ponder this question: daily images of gratuitous violence; an epidemic of suicide; feeling suffocated by the imposition of opposite ideologies and their language, starting in school; the potential threat of generative AI; a sense of paralysis in front of the future; suffering and evil devoid of meaning or redemption; general weariness, malaise, numbness, and lack of desire.

These signs suggest that our humanity is asleep. What can reawaken it?

When something wakes us up, things come alive again. If we pay attention to our experience, **these very same signs** reveal that what makes us human is irreducible. We are ill at ease with our apathy because we are made to desire. We feel lonely because we are made to be in relationship. We feel empty when we “check-out” because we are meant to be “checked-in.” We feel disappointed because to be born comes with a promise. We are afraid because we have something to lose. We feel suffocated because we are made to be free and to affirm what is true. And we feel lost because we are made for a purpose.
